Common Name	Latin Name	Evergreen vs. Deciduous	Size at Maturity	Growth Rate	Special Characteristics	Addresses to View Trees
Bronze Loquat	Eriobotrya deflexa	E	20-30'	Moderate	Beautiful, heavy textured tree with interesting foliage. Attracts birds. Dense, spreading canopy. Stiff dark green leaves with bronze colored new growth. Creamy-white flowers in clusters. Smooth, grey bark.	548 Laidley 33 Harper
Cajeput Tree	Melaleuca quinquenervia	E	25-30'	Moderate	Shredding, cream colored bark. Moderately dense oval shaped canopy. Blue-green, narrow oval leaves. Yellow-white flowers in clusters in summer. Hard brown seed capsules. Creamy to brown shredding bark. Disease and pest resistant. Good for 2x3 and under wires.	433 Congo 515 Edna
Fernleaf Catalina Ironwood	Lyonothamnus floribundus asplenifolius	E	25-35'	Moderate	California native. Good street tree for coastal areas. Needs good drainage. Dark green, narrow deeply lobed leaves. Fernlike. Tiny white flowers. Rough, shredding red-brown bark. Good for coastal areas.	1315 Monterey Blvd.
Fern Pine	Podocarpus gracilior	E	25-35'	Slow	Clean and neat. Fresh, bright green foliage when well watered. Irregular form, dense canopy. Dark blue-green narrow leaves. New foliage light green. Shade tolerant. Good for 2x3 and in narrow sidewalks.	1845 Monterey Blvd.
Italian Buckthorn	Rhamnus alaternus	E	Ht. 20-35' Spread 20'	Moderate	Irregular form, dense canopy. Smaller, glossy dark green, oval shaped leaves. Insignificant flowers. Does produce small berries. Disease and pest resistant. Tolerates many conditions including strong wind. Hardy and low maintenance.	542 Hearst 436 Edna
New Zealand Christmas Tree	Metrosideros excelsus	E	Ht. 25-35' Spread 25'	Moderate	Very hearty tree for coastal conditions. Dense, oval canopy. Dark green leaves w/ white undersides. Red bottle-brush flowers. Disease and pest resistant. 4x4 basin required and root barrier recommended.	411 Edna 114 Encline
Peppermint Willow	Agonis flexuosa	E	Ht. 25-30' Spread 15-30'	Fast	Weeping form. Long narrow leaves smell like peppermint when crushed. Small white flowers in spring. Needs good structural training when young. Good for locations with overhead wires. Disease and pest resistant	400 Congo 462 Hearst 465 Teresita

Primrose Tree	Lagunaria patersonii	E	Ht. 20-40' Spread 15-30'	Moderate to fast	Upright pyramidal form with a dense canopy. Thick, oval leaves olive-green above, grey below. Pink, hibiscus-looking flowers darken with age. Dry seed pods drop after flowers wilt away.	494 Arlington St. 654 Joost Ave.
Small-leaf Tristania	Tristania laurina	E	25-30'	Slow	Narrow green leaves, low maintenance, high wind tolerance. Small yellow flowers. Good tree for small basins. Slow growing.	234 Hearst 459 Teresita
Southern Magnolia	Magnolia grandiflora	E	20-40'	Slow to moderate	Large, white, fragrant flower. Formal. Prefers some wind protection and regular water. Can take poor drainage, heavy soil. Recommend 4x4' basin.	300 San Benito Way 1083 Portola Dr.
Strawberry Tree	Arbutus 'Marina'	E	Ht. 25-30' Spread 25'	Slow to moderate	Pink lantern-shaped flowers persists throughout most of the year. Smooth red bark. Good tree for small spaces. Dense, round to spreading canopy. Produces round red squishy fruit that attracts birds. Good for 2x3.	450 Edna 9 Bella Vista 554 Hearst
Victorian Box	Pittosporum undulatum	E	25-40'	Moderate	White fragrant flowers attract birds and bees. Roots can become invasive with age. Dark green glossy, wavy leaves. White fragrant flowers and orange berries. Sidewalk clean up of fruit and flower drop in Winter.	523 Teresita
Chinese Elm	Ulmus parvifloia 'Drake'	Semi-D	Ht. 25-35' Spread 25'	Fast	Spreading form with weeping limbs and dense canopy. Dark green serrated leaves in oval leaflets have lacy look. Mottled, puzzle-like bark. Small winged seeds. 4x4 basin recommended and root barrier.	109 Chilton 810 Silver
Flowering Cherry	Prunus serrulata 'Kwanzan'	D	15-25'	Moderate	Spring flowers. Fall color. Good tree for small basins and beneath overhead wires. Attracts birds. Does not tolerate strong winds.	531 Genessee; 35 Los Palmos
Flowering Pear	Pyrus calleryana	D	25-30'	Moderate	Upright, oval to round canopy. Fall color dependent on temps. Delicate white fragrant flowers in spring. Prune to encouraging healthy branching. Susceptible to fireblight. Tolerates drought, poor drainage, any soil, fog, smog, moderate winds, and extreme temperatures.	2583 14th Ave 284 Los Palmos
Sawleaf Zelkova	Zelkova serrata	D	To 55'	Moderate to Fast	Round or umbrella shape tree. Oblong to ovate medium green leaves. Fall color. Inconspicuous flowers & fruit. Tolerates clay, loam, or sand. Smooth grey, light brown, or green bark. Recommend 4x4 basin.
